
CLASSROOM JEOPARDY—Concept Reinforcement, Review, & Assessment

This will show you how to design and make your own version CLASSROOM JEOPARDY so you can use it for whichever subject. This game is a great and fun way to re-introduce concepts previously covered. By changing words and introducing higher level questions this is an excellent way to review and reinforce information and assess current student understanding. Things such as sound clips and authorized images and clips can be incorporated as well. Actually designing the powerpoint presentation when you have the questions and answers in hand will take you about 30 minutes.

Materials: Microsoft Office XP Standard Version 2002
(Some versions may not have all the sound clips you may want to insert into the program—if you desire to incorporate them you will need to find them)
Speakers for the computer & connecting wires

Procedure:

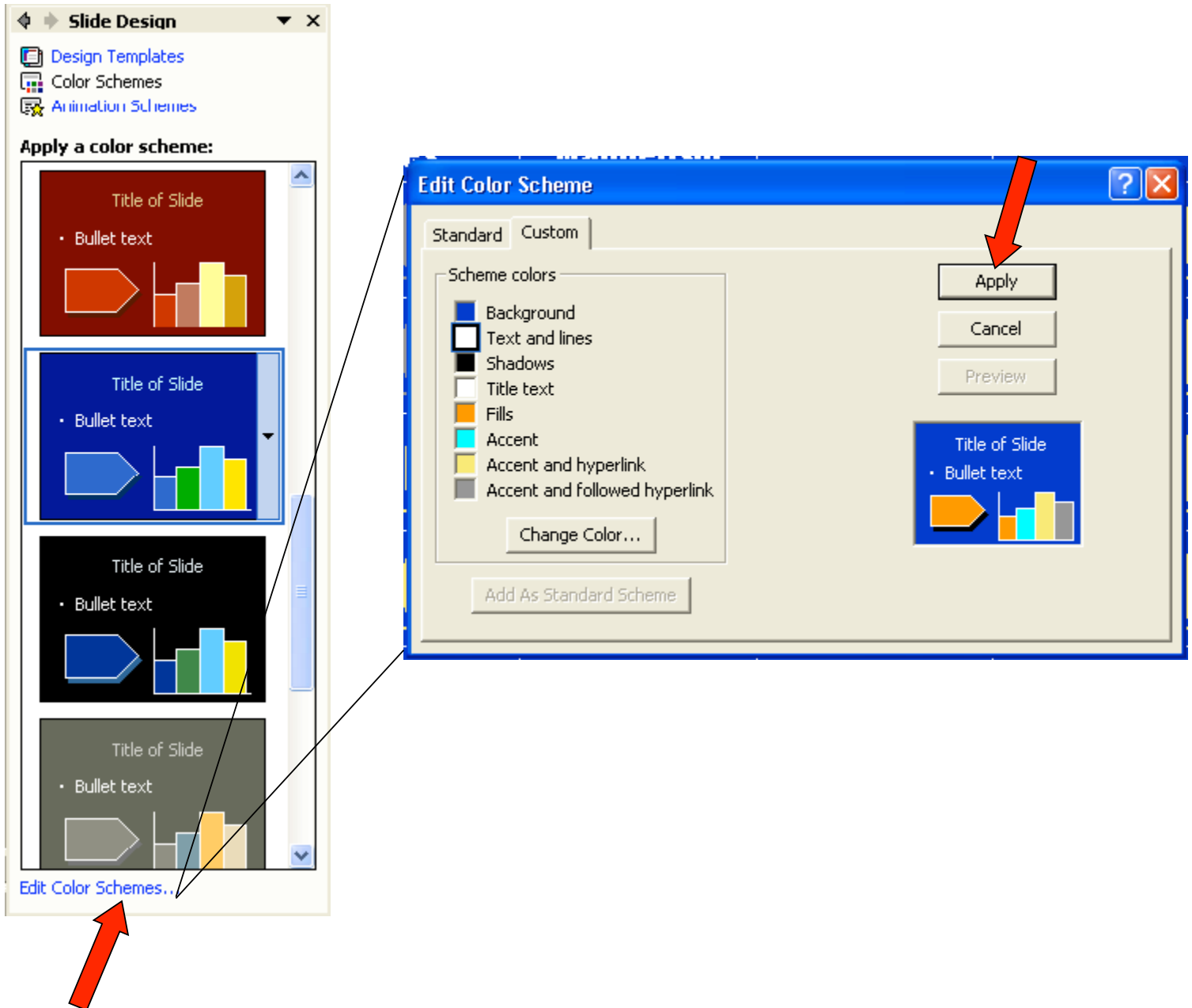
1. Begin by selecting a particular design for your game show. Hit the “Design” button on the upper right corner of the screen. What will pop up is a list down the right hand side of your screen allowing you to select the appropriate layout.
 - a. You can click on “Color Schemes” and then select your own color to design a solid blue background.



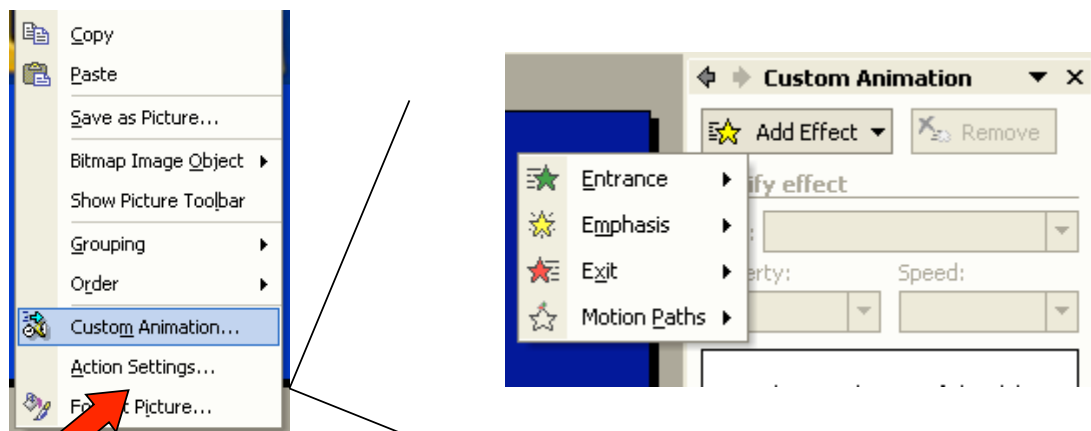
b. When you edit “Color Schemes” a menu will replace the Design Templates.

- Select “Text and lines” so that they are in contrast to your background.
- Set “Accent and hyperlink” to a different colour than the rest of your text. This is the colour your point values will appear on the game board.

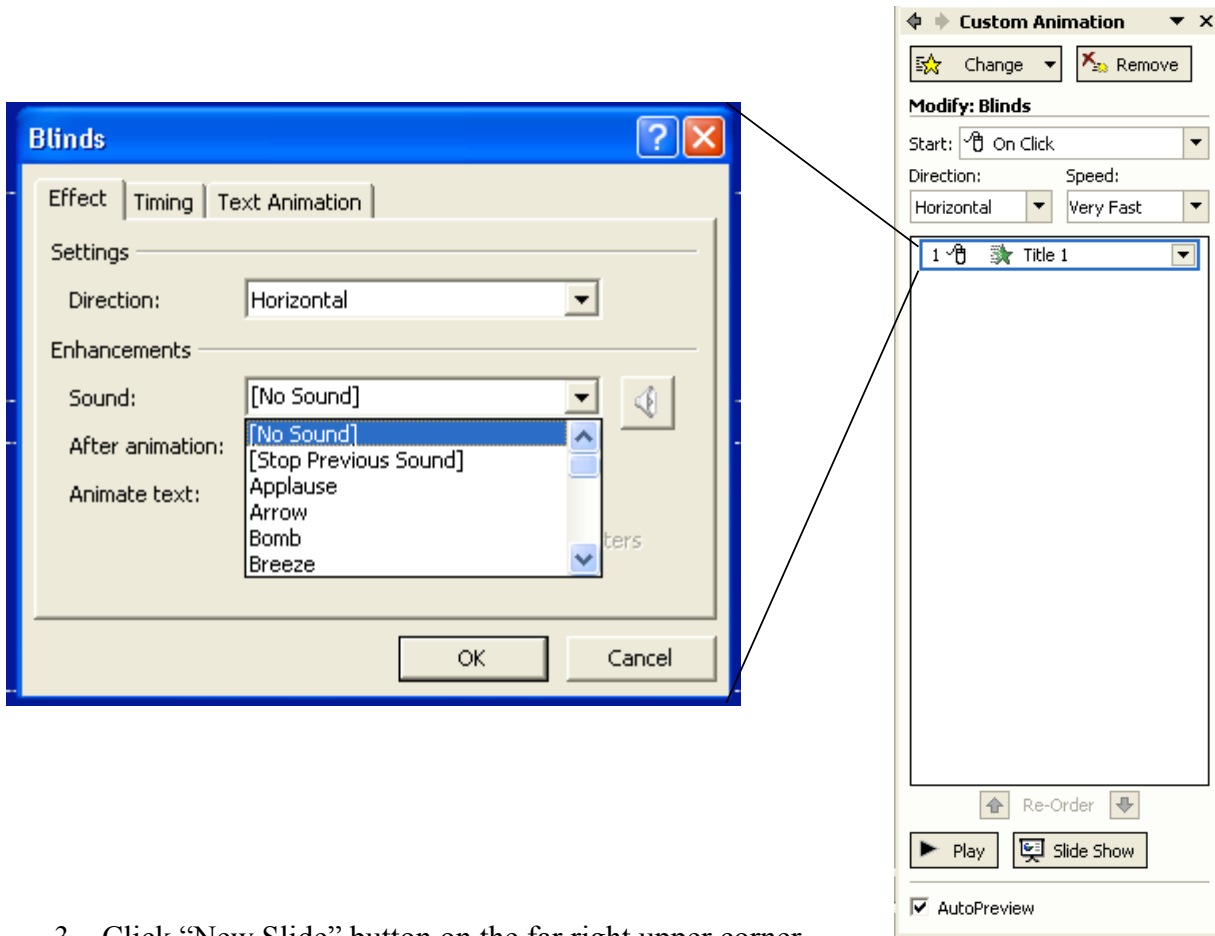
- Set “Accent and followed hyperlink” to a 3rd colour. This will be the colour of the used point values.



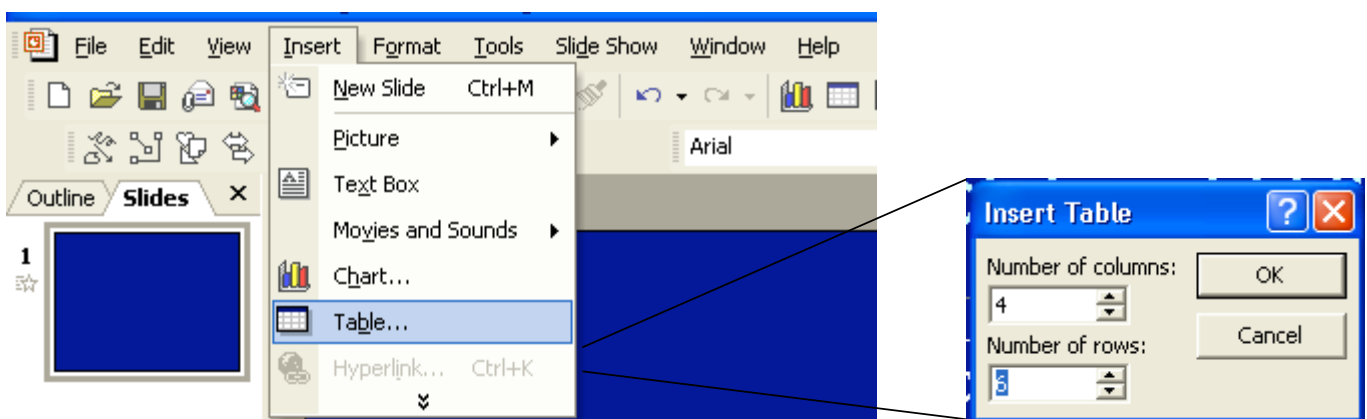
2. For the first slide, insert your title for the game. You can animate it by highlighting the image or your writing and RIGHT CLICKING on it.
 - a. Select your entrance animation.



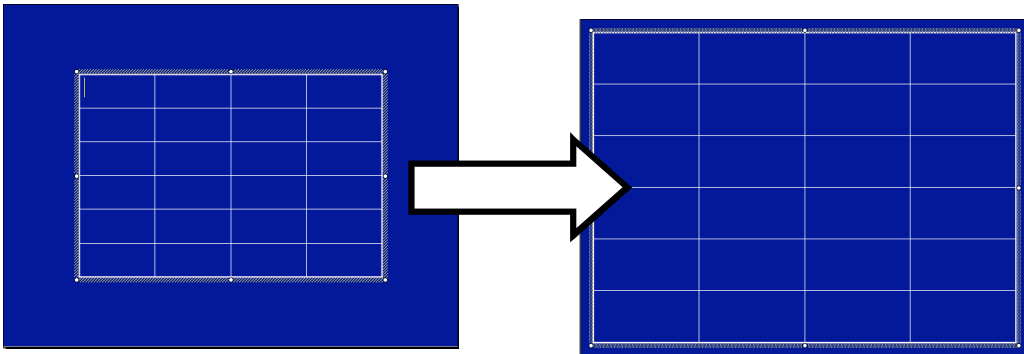
- b. You can add a sound clip by double clicking you the effect that pops up on the right hand column. When the effect box pops up select a sound clip from the list supplied or import your own (MUST BE A WAV FILE) and hit “OK”.



3. Click “New Slide” button on the far right upper corner.
4. This is the slide where you will make the game board.
 - a. Click on “Insert” on the top row of options.
 - b. Select “Table”.
 - c. Depending on how many topics and point values in each topic you want you can alter the values that will pop up. For a standard 4 topic by 5 levels of point value, select 4 columns and 6 rows. Click “OK”.



5. The table that will pop up will be a fraction of your screen. Enlarge it to fit the slide.



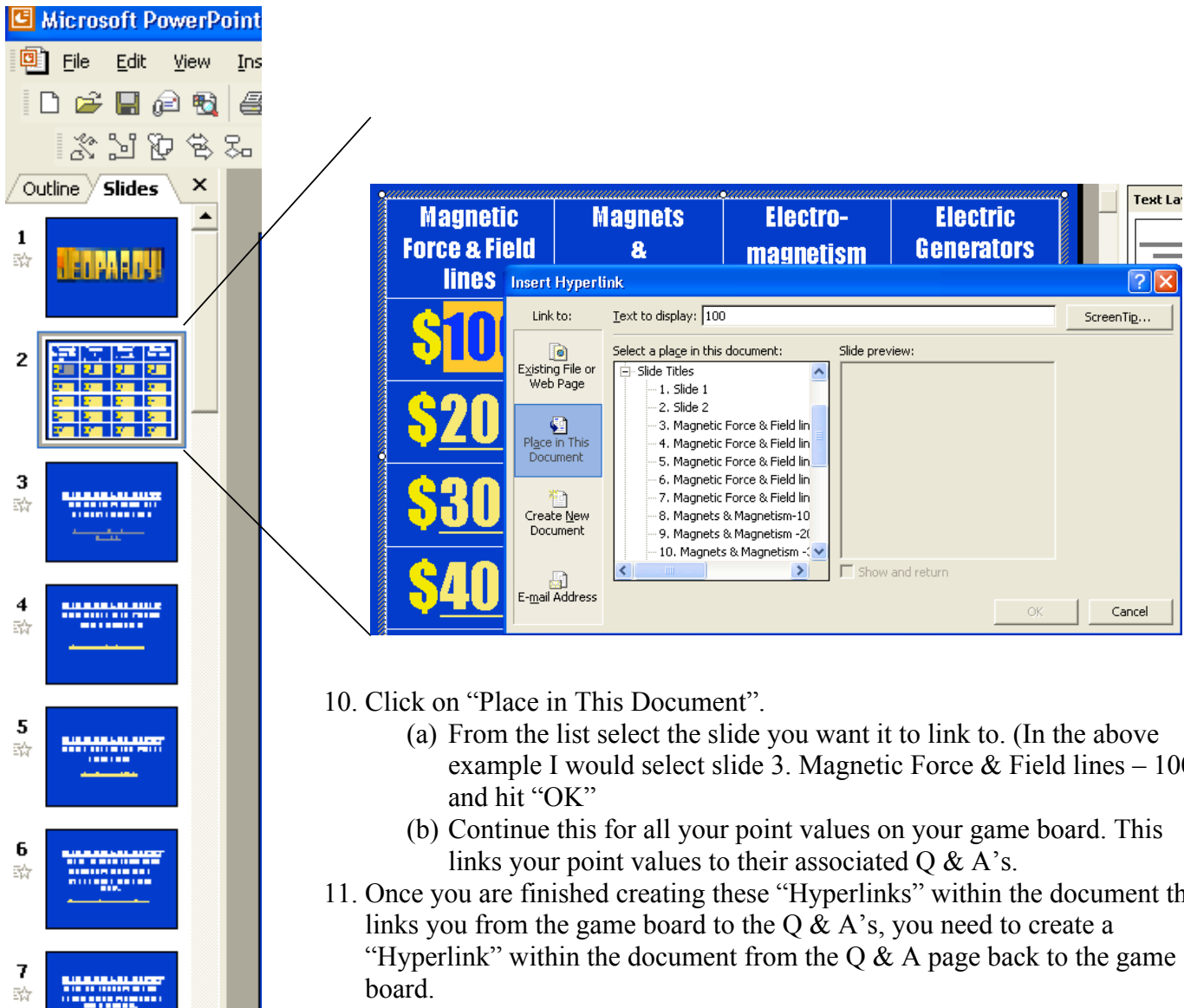
6. Insert your topic in the top row and type in point values in the columns.

Magnetic Force & Field lines	Magnets & Magnetism	Electro-magnetism	Electric Generators

7. Insert more slides and type in the questions on top and the answer is on the bottom.
- a. Add a custom animation for the answer. This will ensure it will only pop up when you click the mouse.
 - b. See above on directions about how to add a custom animation.
 - c. You can add a sound effect if you like. “Chime” works well.



8. Keep adding all your slides for questions and answers.
9. When you are done with your Q & A slides return to the game board slide.
 - (a) You can do so by clicking on slide 2 on the left hand column of your screen.
 - (b) Highlight the value you want to link the Q & A to.
 - (c) Hit AT THE SAME TIME (while your value is highlighted) “CTRL” + “k”



10. Click on “Place in This Document”.
 - (a) From the list select the slide you want it to link to. (In the above example I would select slide 3. Magnetic Force & Field lines – 100) and hit “OK”
 - (b) Continue this for all your point values on your game board. This links your point values to their associated Q & A’s.
11. Once you are finished creating these “Hyperlinks” within the document that links you from the game board to the Q & A’s, you need to create a “Hyperlink” within the document from the Q & A page back to the game board.
 - (a) Go to each slide and highlight the answer. Hit “CTRL” + “k” at the same time.
 - (b) Select Slide 2 for each. After each Q & A is viewed by clicking on the answer you will be returned to the game board.
 - (c) Because you have visited the associated Q & A “Hyperlink” when you return to the game board the hyperlink will be a different colour—showing you that that particular question has been asked already.
12. When you are all finished creating hyperlinks to the Q & A and from each answer on each Q & A page back to the game board you are ready to play!
 - (a) Save your creation
 - (b) Hit “F5” and you can play the game with your class and use your mouse to navigate.
 - (c) In order to restart the game and ensure that each “hyperlink” is treated as if it hasn’t been viewed you need to close the game and reopen it each time you want to restart.
